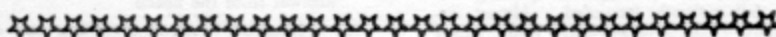

AWARDS FOR THE DIEPPE RAID, 19 AUGUST, 1942 AS PUBLISHED IN THE
SUPPLEMENT TO THE LONDON GAZETTE OF 2nd OCTOBER, 1942.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of The VICTORIA CROSS to:—

Captain (temporary Major) Patrick Anthony Porteous (73033), Royal Regiment of Artillery (Fleet, Hants.).

At Dieppe on the 19th August, 1942, Major Porteous was detailed to act as Liaison Officer between the two detachments whose task was to assault the heavy coast defence guns.

In the initial assault Major Porteous, working with the smaller of the two detachments, was shot at close range through the hand, the bullet passing through his palm and entering his upper arm. Undaunted, Major Porteous closed with his assailant, succeeded in disarming him and killed him with his own bayonet thereby saving the life of a British Sergeant on whom the German had turned his aim.

In the meantime the larger detachment was held up, and the officer leading this detachment was killed and the Troop Sergeant-Major fell seriously wounded. Almost immediately afterwards the only other officer of the detachment was also killed.

Major Porteous, without hesitation and in the face of a withering fire, dashed across the open ground to take over the command of this detachment. Rallying them, he led them in a charge which carried the German position at the point of the bayonet, and was severely wounded for the second time. Though shot through the thigh he continued to the final objective where he eventually collapsed from loss of blood after the last of the guns had been destroyed.

Major Porteous's most gallant conduct, his brilliant leadership and tenacious devotion to a duty which was supplementary to the role originally assigned to him, was an inspiration to the whole detachment.

The KING has been graciously pleased to approve the award of The VICTORIA CROSS to:—

Lieutenant-Colonel Charles Cecil Ingersoll Merritt, The South Saskatchewan Regiment.

For matchless gallantry and inspiring leadership whilst commanding his battalion during the Dieppe raid on the 19th August, 1942.

From the point of landing, his unit's advance had to be made across a bridge in Pourville which was swept by very heavy machine-gun, mortar and artillery fire: the first parties were mostly destroyed and the bridge thickly covered by their bodies. A

daring lead was required; waving his helmet, Lieutenant-Colonel Merritt rushed forward shouting "Come on over! There's nothing to worry about here."

He thus personally led the survivors of at least four parties in turn across the bridge. Quickly organizing these, he led them forward and when held up by enemy pill-boxes he again headed rushes which succeeded in clearing them. In one case he himself destroyed the occupants of the post by throwing grenades into it. After several of his runners became casualties, he himself kept contact with his different positions.

Although twice wounded Lieutenant-Colonel Merritt continued to direct the unit's operations with great vigour and determination and while organizing the withdrawal he stalked a sniper with a Bren gun and silenced him. He then coolly gave orders for the departure and announced his intention to hold off and "get even with" the enemy. When last seen he was collecting Bren and Tommy guns and preparing a defensive position which successfully covered the withdrawal from the beach.

Lieutenant-Colonel Merritt is now reported to be a Prisoner of War.

To this Commanding Officer's personal daring, the success of his unit's operations and the safe re-embarkation of a large portion of it were chiefly due.

The Conspicuous Gallantry Medal.

Ordinary Seaman Thomas Albert Lee, C/JX.299940.

While the craft in which Ordinary Seaman Lee was serving was beached for some fifteen minutes landing tanks, under concentrated fire, her guns were kept in action against an enemy gun position and houses on the beach, until all the guns crews had been killed or wounded. Although gravely wounded himself, his cheerful courage and devotion to duty were an example to the rest. He carried on until the guns were silenced and then crawled away to report to his Skipper.

1. The men to serve until a peace with the United States is ratified.
2. To be attested, and to sign a Roll specifying the nature and extent of the engagement.
3. To be subject to the Militia Articles of War.
4. To receive Ten Dollars Bounty, to be laid out in neccessaries for their Euipment in addition to the outfit money granted by the Province.
5. Five Companies, to be composed of fifty men, the Captain to raise 25 the Lieutenants 17 the Ensign 13 and the officers to keep ~~their~~ companies compete.
6. To receive clothing, pay and rations as the Line.
7. Six or more Companies to compose a Battalion, or Corps distinct, and to sanction the appointment of a Major.
8. Cavalry to receive the pay of Dragoons 9 pence - six pence in consideration of furnishing their own horse and 1/9 for forage, together with a ration of provision per diem.
9. Artillery to receive the same pay as in the Royal Artillery.
10. These Corps to be organized and embodied as a Legion - the whole to be under the immediate command and superintendence of a Field officer of the King's army.
11. Men and horses to be inspected by the Field officer Commanding the Levy before they are to be admitted into the service or to incur pay - which is to commence from the day they are approved of.
12. Officers to be recommended by the Inspecting Field officer for the approval of the person administring the Government, or Comm-anded of the Forces.

Captain Roberts to be authorized to enlist men upon the above terms for the Service of St. Joseph's and Michilimackinac.

The Mercantile Marine War Medal was covered in detail in Volume 12, No. 3, September 1976. Details of the service of those who lost their lives in the merchant service can be found in the Register of the Tower Hill Memorial, London (Register 39) It is alphabetical in eight parts. There is no medal roll in the Public Record Office, London. Our former Department of Marine and Fisheries state they do not have a roll. Information on this medal is said to be held at Cardiff. The Public Archives of Canada (RG 42 vols 294) have several files containing applications for the medal. It is a correspondence file and one is never certain that the application was approved however there are some lists of approvals.

Up to 1925 there were 624 Mercantile Marine War Medals awarded in Canada. These were engraved by hand by Albert C. Brown of Ottawa. Approximately 135 British War Medals were awarded as a single medal to members of the Merchant marine who did not enter a war zone. The following is a list of 256 names out of 624 who were awarded this medal:
