

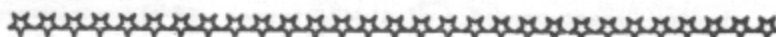

CANADIAN COUPLE RECEIVE RHODESIAN GALLANTRY AWARD

Mr. Douglas and Mrs. Margaret Plumsteel were invested with the Meritorious Conduct Medal on October 20th, 1976, by Rhodesian President John Wrathall at an investiture held at Government House, Salisbury.

Douglas Plumsteel, formerly of West Vancouver, B.C., and his Rhodesian-born wife, Margaret, were returning from a holiday in Rhodesia to South Africa when they were involved in a terrorist incident.

An account of the Action and citation is as follows -

On the evening of Easter Sunday, April 18th, 1976, a group of armed terrorists stepped into the road 12 km south of Nuanetsi and stopped two cars belonging to South Africans returning home from holiday in Rhodesia and robbed the occupants.

Just then, two touring motor-cyclists, with passengers, rode up. After a brief exchange of words the terrorists opened fire on them, killing two and injuring two others, a man and woman. The man later died of his injuries.

In the confusion, the drivers of the two cars which had been held up, drove away fast, leaving the dead and injured lying in the road.

That was when Mr. and Mrs. Plumsteel drove up. At first they thought the motorcycles had crashed but when they stopped, the wounded woman, Miss Vonda Hope-Davies, told them what had taken place.

Mr. Plumsteel, showing "great presence of mind", turned off the motor-cycle lights, ran back to his Land Rover and turned off its headlights so that the terrorists would have no clear targets to shoot at.

He grabbed his rifle, gave a pistol to his wife and they began firing into the brush on both sides of the road.

Then, says the citation for the awards, "while Mrs. Plumsteel continued to fire the revolver, Mr. Plumsteel lifted Miss Hope-Davies into the front seat of the Land Rover. At this point, another car drove up and Mr. Plumsteel gave covering fire while the bodies of the other victims were lifted into the vehicles. Shortly afterwards, a police patrol arrived and escorted the party to Nuanetsi Police Station, where arrangements were made to fly Miss Hope-Davies to a hospital in Fort Victoria. The critically injured motorcyclist died before reaching Nuanetsi. Throughout this most traumatic experience both Mr. and Mrs. Plumsteel displayed great presence of mind and courage. Without regard for their own safety they went to the aid of the victims of this murderous gang."

The Plumsteels used their guns to the best advantage, probably ensuring that the terrorists did not return, says the citation.

"This brave and gallant conduct on the part of both Mr. and Mrs. Plumsteel was over and above the call of duty and in accordance with the highest traditions of Christian civilization."

A Rhodesian Government spokesman revealed that following the Easter attack, Security Forces were successful in killing one of the terrorist gang and seriously injuring another in follow-up operations. The gang later fled into Mozambique and have not been heard from since. Security Forces seized substantial quantities of war material and recovered some of the stolen property from the ambushed cars.

The Meritorious Conduct Medal is awarded "for brave and gallant conduct, above the call of duty, by people in a non-combatant role", is a round medal, engraved with the head of Cecil John Rhodes, and hangs from a plum coloured ribbon.

Musings On A Medal

THE AUTHOR

Mr. E. Fletcher, the writer of this interesting story, served with the Imperial Army in Jersey, Ireland, China, Gibraltar, South Africa, France and Flanders. Coming to Canada after the Great War, he joined the Winnipeg Light Infantry and, later, the Cameron Highlanders of Canada. He retired in 1937, after 42 years service with His Majesty's Forces.



THE medal shown in the accompanying illustration, sometimes erroneously called the Peninsular War Medal but officially known as the Military General Service Medal, was issued in 1848, 34 years after the close of the campaign for which it was granted.

At the close of hostilities in 1814 only two classes were awarded a medal: Generals and Field Officers, and the medal was of gold. In 1816, the Regent, George IV, granted a silver medal to all soldiers engaged in the Battle of Waterloo. It was not until 1848, however, that the first General Service Medal was granted by Her Majesty Queen Victoria. This medal was also issued, with suitable clasps, to Canadian Militiamen and Indians who served in the War of 1812. The relatives of soldiers who had died during the intervening 34 years did not receive the medal.

The medal shown, the original of which is now in the possession of a member of the Canadian Legion, was granted to William Robertson, of the 52nd Regiment of Foot, now known as the Second Battalion The Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire Light Infantry.

CANADIAN ASSOCIATION

This famous regiment is of particular interest to Canadians because of its close association with Canada in the 18th and early 19th centuries. It was on January 7th, 1756, that George II granted the Royal Warrant to enlist men for the regiment, as follows:

"George R.

"These are to authorize you, by beat of drum or otherwise, to raise men in any county or part of our kingdom of Great Britain for a Regiment of Foot under your command, which is to consist of Ten Companies, of three Sergeants, three Corporals, two Drummers, and seventy effective Private Men in each Company, besides Commission Officers. And all Magistrates, Justices of the Peace, Constables, and other our Civil Officers whom it may concern, are hereby required to be assisting with you in providing quarters, impressing carriages, and otherwise, as there shall be occasion.

"Given at our Court at St. James, this

"7th day of January, 1756, in the twenty-ninth year of our reign.

"By His Majesty's Command, Barrington.

"To our trusty and well-beloved Hedworth Lambton, Esq., Colonel of our 54th Regiment of Foot, to be forthwith raised, or to the Officers appointed to raise men for our said Regiment."

In 1758 the regiment proceeded to Ireland, where it remained until June 6th, 1765, on which date it embarked at Cork for Quebec, where it arrived in August of the same year.

In the Royal Warrant of December 19th, 1768, containing regulations for the colours, clothing, etc., of the marching regiments of foot, it was directed that the King's, or first, colour of the regiment should be the Great Union; the second, or regimental, colour, was to be of buff silk, with the Union in the upper canton, and in the centre of the colour the rank of the regiment, in gold Roman characters within a wreath of roses and thistles on the same stalk. The colour of the facings on the tunic was buff, the red coat being faced and lined with buff, and ornamented with white lace, with a red worm and one orange stripe; buff waistcoats and breeches, and black gaiters.

BROWN BESS

Their arms included the old British Army musket, the "Brown Bess", which served the Army so well for 114 years, from 1700 to 1814.

"In the days of lace ruffles, perukes and brocade,

Brown Bess was a partner whom none could despise,
An out-spoken, flinty-lipped, brazen-faced jade,
With a habit of looking men straight in the eyes.
At Blenheim and Ramillies fops would confess
They were pierced to the heart by the charms of Brown Bess."

Towards the middle of the year 1774 the 52nd left Canada and proceeded by sea to Boston, and it was 49 years before they returned to Canada. During this period they saw active service in the American Revolutionary War, and at the close of this conflict the regiment returned to England, in 1778. Early in March of 1783 the 52nd sailed for Madras and remained in India for 15 years, during which they served in the two campaigns against Tippeo Sahib. In 1795 and 1796 they assisted in the annexation of Ceylon from the Dutch. On February 20th, 1821, King George IV authorized the 52nd Light Infantry to bear on its colours and appointments the word "Hindoostan," in commemoration of the distinguished services of the Regiment in the several actions in which it had been engaged in India from September, 1790, to September, 1793.

The regiment returned to England in 1798. In 1800 it sailed for the Bay of Quiberon, but left there almost immediately for Ferrol in Spain, taking part in skirmishes at Ferrol, Cadiz and Lisbon, and returning to England on January 26, 1801. On May 8, 1801, Major-General John Moore, afterwards the celebrated Sir John Moore, was appointed colonel of the regiment, and he instigated extensive reforms in the drill and equipment. But old Brown Bess remained.

"When ruffles were turned into stiff leather stocks,
And people wore pigtails instead of perukes,
Brown Bess never altered her iron-grey looks,
She knew she was valued for more than her looks.
'Oh powder and patches was always my dress,
And I think I am killing enough,' said Brown Bess."

AT WATERLOO

The regiment fought in the principal actions of the Peninsular War, and at the Battle of Waterloo was commanded by Colonel Colborne, who had succeeded Sir John Moore as colonel of the regiment. This battle saw the finish of the Peninsular War, and also the finish as an Army weapon of Brown Bess.

"She had danced till the dawn of that terrible day,
She danced till the dusk of more terrible night,
And before her linked squares his battalions gave way.

A GREAT RIDE

And her long fierce quadrilles put his
dancers to flight;
And when his gill carriage drove off in
the press,
'I have danced my last dance for the
world,' said Brown Bess.
If you go to museums—there's one in
Whitehall—
Where old weapons are shown with their
names writ beneath,
You will find her upstanding, her back
to the wall,
As stiff as a ramrod, the flint in her
teeth.
And if ever we English had reason to
bless
Any arm save our mother's, that arm is
Brown Bess."

Embarking at Queenston (now Cobh) in Ireland, the 52nd returned to Canada, landing at Halifax about July 15th, 1824, still under the command of Colonel Colborne who afterwards, as Sir John Colborne (later raised to the peerage and known as Lord Seaton), became Governor-General of the North American Provinces. He is described by Napier as "a man of singular talents for war . . . the union of talents of such high order with such extended experience is rarely to be met with."

At the time of writing an American aviator is attempting to circle the world in five days, and appears very likely to do it. This is in sharp contrast to the recorded incident told of Captain R. D. King of the 52nd. In the autumn of 1830, 108 years ago, a border incident arose between American and New Brunswick authorities which made urgently necessary communication between Halifax and Fredericton in the shortest possible time. This was a journey which took four days in the summer season. Captain Moorsom, the Quartermaster, whose duty it was to provide for the service, thought it might be done in 36 hours. Great doubts were freely expressed as to the possibility of its being done, but the Lieut.-General was satisfied, and Captain King, well-known for his active energy and boldness as a rider, was selected for the mission.

Starting in the afternoon, he rode the first 130 miles in less than twelve hours, got a nap on board the steamboat while crossing the Bay of Fundy, again took saddle at St. John and reached Fredericton within the 36 hours assigned. From Fredericton upwards, Capt. King could only proceed by canoe along the river, the current of which was stemmed for nearly 80 miles in one long and hard day's work. He found the Major-General on the frontier, and upon delivery of his despatch, dispositions were made which rendered any sudden hostile collision with the Americans almost impossible.

On the departure of the 52nd for England in 1831, a most flattering address was presented to the officers and men by the magistrates and residents of Halifax.

Brown Bess and shades of the men who fought with her at Mandora, Albuera, Salamanca, Orthes, Ciudad Rodrigo, Waterloo, Inkerman, Sebastopol, and on through years of war and strife until 1914-18! Were they watching while the men of Vimy played their part and died for an ideal that never seems to materialize

at least we who were left have yet to find the realization of the hope that one day war would end war. Yet they died and we were left, but

Not unto us, O Lord, to tell
Thy purpose in the blast,
When those who towered beyond us fell,
And we were overpast.

We cannot guess how goodness springs
From the black tempest's breath,
Nor scan the birth of gentler things
From those red bursts of death.

We only know from good and great
Nothing save good can flow;
That where the cedar crashed so straight
No crooked tree shall grow;

That from their ruin a taller pride
Not for these eyes to see—
Shall clothe one day the valley side,
Amen nobis, Domine.

This Naval and Military Order of Distinction was instituted by Queen Victoria, September 8th, 1886, as a means of rewarding individual instances of meritorious or distinguished service in war.

Synopsis of the statutes relating thereto:—

(1) This Order is designated the "Distinguished Service Order."

(2) It consists of the Sovereign, and of such Companions as the Sovereign shall appoint.

(3) The Kings and Queens Regnant of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Emperors and Empresses of India, are Sovereigns of the Order.

(4) No person is eligible for this distinction who does not actually hold, at the time of his nomination, a Commission in the Navy, in Land Forces, of Marines, or in the Indian or Colonial Naval or Military Forces, or a Commission in one of the Departments of the Navy or Army, the holder of which is entitled to Honorary or Relative Rank, nor may any person be nominated unless his services shall have been marked by the special mention of his name, by the Admiral or Senior Naval Officer commanding a Squadron or detached Naval Force, or by the Commander-in-Chief of the Forces in the Field, in despatches for meritorious or distinguished service in the Field, or before the enemy.

(5) Foreign Officers who have been associated in Naval and Military operations with the British Forces are eligible to be Honorary Members of this Order.

(6) Appointment is made by Warrant under Royal Sign Manual, countersigned by one of the Principal Secretaries of State.

(7) This Order ranks next to and immediately after the Order of the Indian Empire, and the Companions take precedence immediately after the Companions of the said Order of the Indian Empire and shall rank among themselves according to the dates of their respective nominations.

(8) The Badge of the Order consists of a gold cross, enamelled white, edged gold, having on one side, in the centre, within a wreath of laurel, enamelled green, the Imperial Crown in gold, upon a red enamelled ground, and on the reverse, within a similar wreath and on a similar red ground, the Imperial and Royal Cypher V.R.I., and is suspended from the left breast by a red ribbon, edged blue, of one inch in width.

(9) The names of those upon whom the decoration is conferred are published in the London Gazette, and a registry thereof is kept in the office of the Secretary of State for War.

3 D.S.Os. and 6 Military Crosses a month from 1st July, 1916 (increased from 1 D.S.O. and 2 Military Crosses, the allotment in force from 1st January, 1916).

D.C.Ms., Military Medals, Meritorious Service Medals, Indian Order of Merit, and Distinguished Service Medals without limit.

MESOPOTAMIA.

20 D.S.Os. and 40 Military Crosses a month dating from 1st January, 1918 (increased from 10 D.S.Os. and 20 Military Crosses, the allotment before that date).

D.C.Ms., Military Medals, Meritorious Service Medals, Indian Order of Merit, and Distinguished Service Medals without limit.

ITALY.

6 D.S.Os., 15 Military Crosses a month as from 1st March, 1918 (reduced from 20 D.S.Os. and 50 Military Crosses, the allotment in force from 1st November, 1917).

D.C.Ms., Military Medals and Meritorious Service Medals without limit.
