CANADIAN ORDERS, DECORATIONS AND MEDALS

Introductory note

This is an attempt, primarily for ribbon collectors, to describe the ribbons of those orders, decorations and medals, known to the writer, that are peculiar to Canada, in that (at any rate, in so far as the official awards are concerned):

- (a) They were specifically instituted, by Royal Warrant, for Canada, or were instituted by the Canadian or any Provincial Government; and
- (b) Other than awards made by the Order of St John of Jerusalem, the name of Canada, or a Canadian Province, appears on the medals or other pieces, or bars affixed to them, or other identification, including ribbon pattern.

There are not listed here, therefore, British awards for which Canadians have been, and are, eligible as Imperial or Commonwealth citizens. These include, inter alia, awards to members of the Royal Canadian Navy and Naval Reserve since they do not fall within the definition given above. However, mention is made of Imperial awards that have superseded, or been superseded by, Canadian ones.

It will be noted that awards have been listed in date order, as instituted, and not in order of precedence, except the St John Service Medal which, for reasons of convenience, has been placed immediately following the Order of St John. The sequence for wearing the ribbons of current Federal awards is given as an Appendix.

It will be noted that measurements are given in millimetres, conversion having been made, where necessary, to the nearest half-millimetre. It has to be appreciated in this connexion that ribbon measurements tend to vary according to "wintage". I need hardly mention that miniature width ribbons, not listed here, have been officially authorised in most if not all cases.

"Further award" following a ribbon description means award of a bar or clasp.

The writer is grateful for the assistance he has received from Mr B.G. Faulconbridge, Professor Ross W. Irwin and Mr J.P. LeBlanc in the preparation of this paper. Additions, corrections and suggestions will be welcomed.

The Order of St John in England, effectively dissolved during the reign of Henry VIII, was revived in 1831 and granted a Royal Charter in 1888. The first St John Ambulance Brigade division in Canada was formed in London, Ontario in 1909, and the Commandery of Canada was created in 1934; this was raised to the dignity of Priory in 1946.

The Priory of Canada is a virtually autonomous Establishment of the Order, responsible for the direction of the work of the Foundations within its jurisdiction.
