DID YOU KNOW? US MEDAL OF HONOR TO CANADIANS

The Medal of Honor (MOH) is the highest military decoration that may be awarded by the government of the United States of America. Did you know that there are 61 Medal of Honor recipients who were from Canada? And more than half of them (34) were awarded during the U.S. Civil War (1861-65) and only four since 1900.

The MOH is actually comprised of three different versions – Navy, Army and Air Force. As of Oct 30, 2019, there have been 3525 awards to 3506 individual recipients, and 19 double awards. The MOH is conferred only upon members of the United States Armed Forces who distinguish themselves through conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of life above and beyond the call of duty.

The MOH was officially created on December 21, 1861 when President Lincoln signed the bill and the (Navy) Medal of Honor was born. The army received its version on July 12, 1862. The army version was also issued to airmen prior to April 14, 1965 when the Air Force version was created. The MOH

is often colloquially referred to as the Congressional Medal of Honor because the President presents the award “in the name of the Congress”. However, it is properly the Medal of Honor.

Among the Canadian recipients were two brothers, Harry and Willard Miller, from Noel Shore, Nova Scotia, who were recognized for their actions on the U.S. ship, USS Nashville in Cuba on May 11, 1898 (Spanish-American War). They became the first of what has become eight pairs of brothers to be awarded the medal. The most recent award to a Canadian-born recipient went to Sgt. (then Sp4) Peter C. Lemon, US Army originally of Toronto for action in Vietnam on April 1, 1970.

According to Wikipedia, there have been 9 different designs for the MOH - 4 Navy, 4 Army and 1 Air Force. From 1862 to 1942 (navy) and 1944 (army), the medal was worn as a breast badge and since then has been worn around the neck suspended from a light blue coloured moiré silk neck ribbon.

LTG ROBERT FRANKLIN FOLEY, (RETIRED)

During a recent cruise vacation to South America, I had the opportunity to meet LTG Robert Foley (retd.). The cruise had a number of military/veteran get-togethers and he was in attendance at most of them. As we all introduced ourselves, he said simply, "Robert Foley retired US Army". One of the other individuals who recognized him made a point of adding that Robert Foley was a Retired Lieutenant General and a Medal of Honor recipient. I was fortunate enough to spend a bit of time with him and his lovely wife during a couple of city tours.

He was asked to speak at the next military gathering on the circumstances which prompted the recommendation for the award, and his talk was amazing, spellbinding actually. During his talk he did not even mention the fact that he was wounded during the event that led to the Medal of Honor being awarded.

The citation says it all and I have copied it here for all to read.

“*The President of the United States of America, in the name of Congress, takes pleasure in presenting the Medal of Honor to Captain Robert Franklin Foley, United States Army, for conspicuous gallantry and intrepidity at the risk of his life above and beyond the call of duty while serving with Company A, 2d Battalion, 27th Infantry Regiment, 25th Infantry Division, in action against enemy aggressor forces at Quan Dau Tieng, Republic of Vietnam,*

on 5 November 1966. Captain Foley's company was ordered to extricate another company of the battalion. Moving through the dense jungle to aid the besieged unit, Company A encountered a strong enemy force occupying well concealed, defensive positions, and the company's leading element quickly sustained several casualties. Captain Foley immediately ran forward to the scene of the most intense action to direct the company's efforts. Deploying one platoon on the flank, he led the other two platoons in an attack on the enemy in the face of intense fire. During this action both radio operators accompanying him were wounded. At grave risk to himself he defied the enemy's murderous fire, and helped the wounded operators to a position where they could receive medical care. As he moved forward again one of his machinegun crews was wounded. Seizing the weapon, he charged forward firing the machinegun, shouting orders and rallying his men, thus maintaining the momentum of the attack. Under increasingly heavy enemy fire he ordered his assistant to take cover and, alone, Captain Foley continued to advance firing the machinegun until the wounded had been evacuated and the attack in this area could be resumed. When movement on the other flank was halted by the enemy's fanatical defense, Captain Foley moved to personally direct this critical phase of the battle. Leading the renewed effort he was blown off his feet and wounded by an enemy grenade. Despite his painful wounds he refused medical aid and persevered in the forefront of the attack on the enemy redoubt. He led the assault on several enemy gun emplacements and, single-handedly, destroyed three such positions. His outstanding personal leadership under intense enemy fire during the fierce battle which lasted for several hours, inspired his men to heroic efforts and was instrumental in the ultimate success of the operation. Captain Foley's magnificent courage, selfless concern for his men and professional skill reflect the utmost credit upon himself and the United States Army. ”

NOMINAL ROLLS OF THE CANADIAN EXPEDITIONARY FORCE

An INVALUABLE information reference source for all interested in WW I CEF personnel. Available is a website by “JAKEALOO” (Steve) which lists nearly 400 CEF Nominal Rolls currently online through Library and Archives Canada. Issued with MILITIA ORDERS, a CEF Nominal Roll is a list of the Officers, NCOs, and Men on strength of a unit of the CEF which was usually compiled prior to a unit embarking for England, likely representing all personnel who actually went overseas.

The Roll often included embarkation information such as ship name, embarkation port and the date of sailing. Listed is a person’s personal data under the headings: Regimental Number, Rank, Name, Former Corps, Name of Next of Kin, Address of Next of Kin, Country of Birth, Place and Date “Taken on Strength”. Sometimes Reinforcing Drafts or a few personnel of other units were recorded at the end of the Roll.

When researching a CEF member, the Nominal Roll entry is likely an official record of the beginning of overseas service, although on arrival in England, one could be sent to any other unit as needed as a reinforcement. BUT the person’s originally issued Regimental Number was permanent and always remained the same, regardless of where CEF service was done.

Data from this website can be an important research beginning, which makes easier the obtaining of a copy of the “Attestation Paper” completed by each person on joining the CEF, which is also available on the Library and Archives Canada website. Have great fun researching!

Keeping Connected

There are many benefits of being a member of the C.S.M.M.I.. Two of them have to be the sharing of information and the camaraderie one experiences being associated with people who share your hobby. The C.S.M.M.I. has communicated with its members through many means. In this article we explore some of these.

The Journal

The C.S.M.M.I. Journal is the signature publication of the Canadian Society of Military Medals & Insignia. It was first published in 1965 and originally known as the "Bulletin". By August 1966 (Vol. 2 issue 3), the publication was beginning to be called a "Journal" - a name that has stuck to today. The Journal provides a platform for members to write about their collecting interests and research. Other features include advertising by leading dealers and suppliers to our hobby, and a classified section where members can post ads to try to complete their collections or seek information.

An on-going project of the C.S.M.M.I. is to scan all previous issues and make them available to the members. These past Journals are full of well-researched articles. To date, the Journals published from 1971 – 1981 have been uploaded to the CSMMI.com website and can be viewed or downloaded. The Journals are placed under the Research section of the website.

The Newsletter

The newsletter has been issued since the founding of the C.S.M.M.I.. Usually a 2 to 4 page format, the newsletter provided information on what was going on with the Society, up-coming meetings, new members, small articles and miscellaneous information. In an age before the internet and email, the newsletter was the main communications tool for the Society. In Summer 2013, the Newsletter was renamed as the C.S.M.M.I. Medallion. The past newsletters have now become a valuable resource of the history and growth of the Society and its members.

The internet started to make in-roads to the public in the mid 1990s. The C.S.M.M.I.'s first webmaster was Tim Burt who created the Society's first website in 2006. Tim continued as the webmaster until 2015 when he turned over the reins to Lawrence Stasiuk. In 2015, a new website was launched and this has grown and been maintained on a regular basis.

The website includes a schedule of C.S.M.M.I. meetings and the annual show, information about the C.S.M.M.I., such as a listing of past presidents, award recipients, and a history of the Society. A valuable service is the events sections that lists shows by other organizations, a calendar of coming events across Canada, and several speaker programs. The Research section includes an archive of past Journals. There are many excellent articles worth re-discovering.

C.S.M.M.I. Facebook Site

For those looking for more frequent and regular contact with fellow hobbyists, than the Canadian Society of Military Medals & Insignia Facebook group is what you may be looking for. This is a private group that is administered by four C.S.M.M.I. members being Bill Alexander, Ken Keegan, Mike McLean and Mike Reintjes. Created on October 18, 2010, the group now has over 900 members. Anyone can find this group, but only members may view the posts. You can receive regular notices and posts of items for sale, items in need, and request for information. Visit the site and ask to join in.

C.S.M.M.I. eBlasts

Members that have provided email addresses to the Membership Secretary and have consented to receiving emails are now getting notices sent directly to their email boxes. The C.S.M.M.I. is also offering to send all Journals and Medallions in a pdf format. This has the benefits of reducing costs for printing and mailing for the Society as well as allowing members the convenience of storing a digital issue rather than filing a printed copy. Of course, the Society will still provide printed versions to those who prefer that format. Anyone not currently receiving emails, or those who wish to unsubscribe from future emails may contact Ken Keegan, Membership Secretary at BCATP8@hotmail.com. Please email Ken your email address so he can update his records.

The C.S.M.M.I. membership is now about 250 members strong spread out across Canada, the USA and a few overseas. The various communications formats help keep everyone feel connected. The aims and objectives of the Society are to advance the study of military orders, decorations, medals, insignia, accoutrements, documents and all related militaria. The Society seeks to encourage popular interest and to gather and publish information in all matters related thereto along educational and historical lines. It also seeks to foster the preservation of such honours, awards, insignia and items of military interest for future generations.
